

**Program Articulation Agreement
Between
Millersville University of Pennsylvania and the Community College of Philadelphia**

This Program Articulation Agreement is between:

College of Graduate Studies and Adult Learning
Millersville University of Pennsylvania
(Millersville, PA)

and

Community College of Philadelphia
(Philadelphia, PA)

Millersville University of Pennsylvania and Community College of Philadelphia set forth the conditions upon which Millersville University of Pennsylvania's College of Graduate Studies and Adult Learning will consider graduates of Community College of Philadelphia to transfer for admission into Millersville University of Pennsylvania's online undergraduate degree completion programs.

Rationale for the Purpose of the Articulation Agreement

This agreement applies only to students earning an approved Associate in Arts (A.A.) or Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree at Community College of Philadelphia for transfer into an appropriate matching online degree completion bachelor degree at Millersville University of Pennsylvania. A list of approved degree/majors is included in this Agreement.

Admissions Requirements and Transfer of Academic Credit

- 1) Students enrolled in an approved associate degree at Community College of Philadelphia and who wish to articulate to an matching Millersville University of Pennsylvania's College of Graduate Studies and Adult Learning online degree completion bachelor degrees must complete the Millersville University of Pennsylvania admission process, including but not limited to Millersville University of Pennsylvania admissions application and submission of all official transcripts from secondary and post-secondary institutions. The application fee will be waived for all students transferring under the terms of this Agreement.
- 2) Millersville University of Pennsylvania agrees that graduates of Community College of Philadelphia's approved associate degrees (as listed in Appendix A) meet the admissions standards of Millersville University of Pennsylvania's College of Graduate Studies and Adult Learning online degree completion bachelor degrees if they satisfy the following conditions:
 - a. Applicants with at least a 2.0 grade point average (GPA) at Community College of Philadelphia are eligible for admission to Millersville University of Pennsylvania.

- b. Prior to matriculation to Millersville University of Pennsylvania, the student will show successful completion of an approved associate degree from Community College of Philadelphia (as listed in Appendix A).
- 3) Millersville University of Pennsylvania agrees that graduates of the Community College of Philadelphia approved associate degree program will be able to transfer courses and credit to Millersville University of Pennsylvania towards the appropriately matching online degree completion bachelor degree as follows:
 - a. A minimum of 60 credit hours has been earned and posted on the Community College of Philadelphia transcript.
 - b. Transfer credit will be awarded for courses with a grade of "C" or above for all courses transferred to Millersville University of Pennsylvania. Grades of "D" will transfer with the understanding that said courses will not fulfill program requirements where a grade of C- or greater is required. Students are responsible for sending Millersville University of Pennsylvania official transcripts for evaluation of credit from Community College of Philadelphia or any other attended institutions, including military transcripts. Credit will also be awarded for AP, CLEP, DANTEs, etc. with appropriate documentation, per guidelines established by the Transfer Articulation Oversight Committee (TAOC) of the PA Department of Education. Developmental courses are not eligible for transfer.
 - c. All coursework transcribed at Community College of Philadelphia beyond those outlined in the appropriate Transfer Guide (as listed in Appendix A) will transfer to Millersville University of Pennsylvania and will be applied to the 120-credit total required for conferral of the baccalaureate degree at Millersville University.
 - d. Any student who has earned an associate degree and completed all requirements of the General Education program at the Community College of Philadelphia will receive a waiver of all Millersville University General Education requirements, with the exception of an Advanced Writing requirement, which is a distinctive General Education requirement at Millersville University.
 - e. Coursework completed at Community College of Philadelphia towards satisfaction of the requirements for the matching bachelor degree will transfer to Millersville University of Pennsylvania as outlined in the appropriate Transfer Guides included in this agreement.
 - i. Students are encouraged to follow the appropriate program-to-program curriculum Transfer Guide (as listed in Appendix A) that specifies for Community College of Philadelphia transfer students the Community College of Philadelphia courses that satisfy requirements needed for both associate and bachelor degree completion.
 - ii. Students who follow the appropriate program-to-program curriculum Transfer Guide as included in this Agreement will be awarded third-year (junior) status allowing a full-time student who enrolls at Millersville University of Pennsylvania to complete a matching bachelor degree program within four full-time fall/spring semesters or no more than 60 credits (or half of the bachelor's degree) provided the student appropriately

sequences their remaining course work at Millersville University of Pennsylvania, including all major, required related, and General Education requirements are completed, and that the 120 credit minimum has been attained.

- f. All students who transfer into Millersville University through this agreement will be required to fulfill all applicable residency requirements of Millersville University and the PA State System of Higher Education current at the time of matriculation into Millersville University.

Financial Incentives

To encourage graduates of the Community College of Philadelphia to transfer to Millersville University of Pennsylvania, Millersville University of Pennsylvania agrees to:

1. Waive the admissions application fee.
2. Award financial aid to students who transfer under this Agreement on the same basis as all other Millersville University of Pennsylvania students with junior status.

Obligations of The Agreement

To facilitate the transfer of Community College of Philadelphia graduates to Millersville University of Pennsylvania in accordance with the foregoing guarantee, the parties agree to the following:

- 1) Encourage Community College of Philadelphia students to meet with representatives from Millersville University of Pennsylvania's College of Graduate Studies and Adult Learning for discussion of issues related to admission and financial aid well in advance of their expected date of entry to the transfer institution.
- 2) To facilitate this, Community College of Philadelphia agrees to invite Millersville University of Pennsylvania Admissions office to participate in virtual or in-person student outreach (e.g.: course visits, transfer fairs, campus visits, and/or open houses, etc.) at least once each semester each fall/spring semester.
- 3) Collaborate in providing students with information and academic advising about this Agreement, Millersville University of Pennsylvania's academic requirements, and the process of transferring to Millersville University of Pennsylvania.
- 4) Assure that appropriate personnel in their respective institutions are aware of this Agreement, will support it and will designate a representative to serve as an institutional liaison to distribute information and maintain the Agreement.
- 5) Faculty from each institution teaching in the respective Departments are encouraged to meet at least annually to discuss issues of curriculum and student development. They will consult with each other about any major changes in policy or curricula that directly affect students transferring under the terms of this Agreement.
- 6) Both Millersville University of Pennsylvania and Community College of Philadelphia will review this Agreement annually and make any changes upon mutual agreement, as needed.

Such changes will become effective when both Community College of Philadelphia and Millersville University of Pennsylvania sign the revised document.

- 7) Exchange aggregate data annually that will contribute to the maintenance and improvement of this Agreement, enhance the transfer process, and promote effective cooperation between institutions.
- 8) Millersville University of Pennsylvania will encourage Community College of Philadelphia transfer students to complete the appropriate associate degree before matriculation to Millersville University of Pennsylvania in order to take advantage of this Agreement. If the Community College of Philadelphia student chooses to transfer and matriculate to Millersville University of Pennsylvania before completion of the associate degree, Millersville University of Pennsylvania will encourage reverse transfer and use the reverse transfer credit process mutually agreed upon by both Community College of Philadelphia and Millersville University of Pennsylvania, in the Statewide Reverse Transfer Agreement.

Renewal or Terminated of Articulation Agreement:

- 1) Both Community College of Philadelphia and Millersville University of Pennsylvania agree to promptly notify the other institution of any substantive curricular modifications to any of the approved associate or bachelor degree programs as listed in Appendix A.. Further, both institutions agree that the terms of this Agreement will not hold without written approval that the curricular changes do not alter the intent of the Agreement.
- 2) Millersville University's Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs and the Vice President for Academic & Student Success at Community College of Philadelphia or their designees, are responsible for identifying, and communicating to each other, changes in the policies or requirements of their respective institutions that affect this Agreement. Modifications to the terms and conditions of this Agreement may only be made by written agreement of the parties. Until such modification by mutual written Agreement, the then-current terms of the Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 3) Provided that all parties execute a copy of this Agreement, this Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original, and all of which together shall constitute one and the same document. This Agreement may be executed by the parties and transmitted by facsimile or electronic transmission, and, if so executed and transmitted, shall be effective as if the parties had delivered an executed original of this Agreement.

Mutual Terms and Conditions: Added section

- 1) The parties agree to continue their respective policies of nondiscrimination based on Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 in regard to sex, age, race, color, creed, national origin, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 and other applicable laws, as well as the provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act. The parties agree to cooperate in the investigation of any claims of discrimination or harassment.
- 2) The laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall govern this agreement. This agreement is not a legally binding contract and is not enforceable in a court or in the Pennsylvania Board of Claims. In the event of a dispute between the parties, advice and

direction will be offered by the Office of the Chancellor of the State System of Higher Education.

- 3) The relationship between the parties to this Agreement to each other is that of independent contractors. The relationship of the parties to this agreement to each other shall not be construed to constitute a partnership, joint venture or any other relationship, other than that of independent contractors.
- 4) Neither of the parties shall assume any liabilities to each other. As to liability to each other for injury or death to persons, or damages to property, the parties do not waive any defense as a result of entering into this agreement. This provision shall not be construed to limit either parties' rights, claims or defenses which arise as a matter of law pursuant to any provisions of this agreement. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to limit the sovereign immunity of the Commonwealth or of the State System of Higher Education or Millersville University
- 5) The terms of the agreement shall remain in effect, except as stipulated in certain previous terms as listed herein, for a period of five years, subsequent to the date of execution of this agreement, unless terminated by either party. Any party may terminate the agreement with or without cause, on the provision of 120 days written notice to the other party. All commitments made to students who have been accepted, but have not yet completed the program at Millersville, will be honored. In the event of a substantial breach, either party may terminate this agreement immediately.
- 6) This Agreement shall only be modified in writing with the same formality as the original Agreement.
- 7) This Agreement represents the entire understanding between the parties. No other prior or contemporaneous oral or written understandings or promises exist in regards to this relationship. This Agreement supersedes any other agreements, restrictions, representations, or warranties, if any, between the two parties hereto with regard to the subject matter contained herein.

The willingness of both institutions to enter this Agreement in order to facilitate the transfer of students from Community College of Philadelphia into Millersville University of Pennsylvania, and to expand their opportunities for academic success there, is indicated by the following signatures.

As a Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (PASSHE) institution, Millersville University recognizes that any student who has earned an associate degree and completed all requirements of the General Education program at the Community College of Philadelphia will receive a waiver of all Millersville University General Education requirements, with the exception of an Advanced Writing requirement Millersville University's distinctive General Education requirement, if not already completed prior to transfer.

A minimum of 30 credits must be taken at Millersville University to meet residency requirements. General Information:

This transfer guide is developed in support of the Program-to-Program and Core-to-Core Transfer Articulation Agreement between Millersville University of Pennsylvania and Community College of Philadelphia. It shows how the Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) in Nursing from Community College of Philadelphia transfers into the fully online Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Nursing and the coursework required at Millersville University after transfer.

The B.S. in Nursing must be completed with a minimum cumulative Community College of Philadelphia grade point average (GPA) of 2.0. **Note: All Community College of Philadelphia Nursing courses transfer as Lower Division Nursing Credits (LDN) and are awarded as a 30-credit block instead of individually.*

Transfer credit will be awarded for courses with a grade of “C” or above for all courses transferred to Millersville University. Grades of “D” will transfer with the understanding that said courses will not fulfill program requirements where a grade of C- or greater is required. Students are responsible for sending Millersville University official transcripts for evaluation of credit from Community College of Philadelphia or any other attended institutions, including military transcripts. Credit will also be awarded for AP, CLEP, DANTES, etc. with appropriate documentation, per guidelines established by the Transfer Articulation Oversight Committee (TAOC) of the PA Department of Education. Developmental courses are not eligible for transfer.

As a Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (PASSHE) institution, Millersville University recognizes that any student who has earned an associate degree and completed all requirements of the General Education program at the Community College of Philadelphia will receive a waiver of all Millersville University General Education requirements, with the exception of an Advanced Writing requirement Millersville University’s distinctive General Education requirement, if not already completed prior to transfer.

A minimum of 30 credits must be taken at Millersville University to meet residency requirements. The courses listed below are subject to change depending on all courses taken at the Community College of Philadelphia and advisement from the academic advisor. Students must meet a minimum of 120 total credits to complete the undergraduate degree at Millersville University.

Transfer guides are created and maintained to help students and staff make appropriate course and program choices. The guides show how the requirements for the appropriate Community College of Philadelphia associate degree transfer to the bachelor's institution. It is, however, possible for program requirements at Community College of Philadelphia or the transfer institution to change without advanced notice.
