



**CORE-TO-CORE and PROGRAM-TO-PROGRAM  
TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT  
between  
COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF PHILADELPHIA  
and  
BRYN MAWR COLLEGE**

**Preface**

Community College of Philadelphia (CCP) and Bryn Mawr College (Bryn Mawr) enter into this Core-to-Core and Program-to-Program Transfer Agreement (Agreement) to facilitate the transfer of CCP students to Bryn Mawr. This Agreement facilitates the transfer of Community College students who earn an appropriate associate degree. This Agreement applies to students who enter Bryn Mawr as full-time undergraduate students. (Bryn Mawr does not admit part-time students.) The admission of only women in the Undergraduate College is in conformity with a provision of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

**The Agreement**

Subject to the terms of this Agreement, students who complete an appropriate associate degree at CCP are assured third-year status at Bryn Mawr. This allows a full-time student to complete requirements for the appropriate A.B.<sup>1</sup> (bachelor's) degree within four full-time fall/spring semesters.

The following terms and conditions apply for CCP graduates:

1. Graduate from CCP with an appropriate associate degree. A list of approved degree/majors included in this Agreement are found in Appendix A. Course selection is described in the transfer guides included in Appendix B of this Agreement.
2. Earn a final cumulative CCP grade point average (GPA) of at least 3.6 and satisfy Bryn Mawr admissions requirements that includes an essay and letter of recommendation.
3. Complete Bryn Mawr's admissions application the semester before the student plans to matriculate to Bryn Mawr (by the posted deadline of March 1<sup>st</sup>). The admissions application fee for Bryn Mawr is waived under this Agreement.
4. Enroll at Bryn Mawr within one year of graduating from CCP.

Students are strongly encouraged to meet with a Bryn Mawr Admissions Representative and/or a CCP Academic Advisor, Counselor to develop a course taking strategy to maximize course transferability.

### **Transfer and Academic Guidelines**

1. Transfer credit will be awarded for courses with a grade of “C” or above for any and all courses transferred to Bryn Mawr. Students are responsible for sending Bryn Mawr official transcripts for evaluation of credit from CCP and all other institutions attended, including military transcripts. Credit may also be awarded for AP or IB, with appropriate documentation, in accordance with Bryn Mawr’s AP credit policies. Credit is not awarded for CLEP. Developmental courses are not eligible for transfer.
2. Students must earn a total of 32 Bryn Mawr units (equivalent to 128 CCP semester hours/credits) to complete the A.B. degree at Bryn Mawr. Students who complete an appropriate associate degree (61 CCP credits or more with a grade of “C” or better in each course) will receive 16 Bryn Mawr units (4 semesters) and will enter as juniors with four full-time fall and spring semesters remaining. A standard full-time Bryn Mawr semester course load is four 1-unit courses. Students must complete the remaining 16 units in residence. This means that students interested in study abroad would need to pursue a summer experience.
3. Students are urged to consult the Bryn Mawr Admissions Liaison to optimize the number of transfer credits they earn. Some courses offered at CCP, including most preprofessional courses, will not transfer to Bryn Mawr.
4. CCP students who transfer are responsible only for requirements in place at Bryn Mawr as of the date of their enrollment at CCP. As such, students are expected to follow the degree requirements listed in the Transfer Guide(s) included in Appendix B of this Agreement, which will be reviewed by the Parties and updated at least biennially, in writing. Students who do not follow these transfer guides may not maximize the transfer of credits.
5. Students who have pursued a CCP associate degree study other than those designated in this Agreement or who do not earn the associate degree in the designated curricula and who wish to transfer to Bryn Mawr are not covered by this Agreement. Such students will be considered for admissions on an individual basis and their credits will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis.

### **Core-to-Core**

Bryn Mawr agrees to accept the General Education embedded in the associate degrees included in this Agreement as meeting all the general education requirements of its undergraduate General Education requirements except for the following two requirements:

1. Math 161 or higher
2. Two semesters of the same world language (regardless of proficiency)

All students must satisfy these two requirements regardless of their academic program but all courses may be taken at CCP for transfer to Bryn Mawr.

Bryn Mawr additionally requires of all transfer students two Physical Education electives and satisfaction of the Bryn Mawr swim requirement.

This core-to-core Agreement applies to only to those A.A. and A.S. degrees included in this Agreement.

### **Financial and Scholarship Incentives**

To encourage CCP graduates to transfer to Bryn Mawr, Bryn Mawr agrees to the following:

1. **Application Fee:** Bryn Mawr will waive the application fee for students who apply at Bryn Mawr pursuant to this Agreement.
2. **Academic Scholarships:** Bryn Mawr agrees to award academic scholarships annually (for the four semesters contemplated by this Agreement) to CCP students admitted to Bryn Mawr pursuant to this Agreement:

Bryn Mawr will meet 100% of demonstrated need for all students admitted into Bryn Mawr as per this Agreement thereby eliminating or reducing loan obligations.

- All scholarships are awarded using the final minimum cumulative CCP GPA as noted in the official CCP transcript, honoring CCP's academic amnesty and time amnesty policies. Bryn Mawr also agrees to not recalculate a student's GPA to include grades from any other colleges or universities they may have attended.
  - This scholarship is awarded for the fall and spring semesters only.
  - Scholarships may be renewed each year contingent upon the students submitting their FAFSA and CSS profile, and their remaining in good academic standing at Bryn Mawr.
3. **Financial Aid:** All students will be provided with financial aid information and receive full consideration for Bryn Mawr financial aid upon matriculation at Bryn Mawr.
    - Financial Aid will be awarded to CCP students on the same basis as all other Bryn Mawr students with junior status. They will have equal access to all state and federal financial aid programs.
    - Students are required to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FASFA) and the College Board College Scholarship Service (CSS profile) before March 1<sup>st</sup> each year to determine if they are eligible for financial aid and/or a state grant.

### **Obligations of The Agreement**

To facilitate the transfer of CCP graduates to Bryn Mawr in accordance with the foregoing guarantee, the parties agree to the following:

1. Encourage CCP students to meet with representatives from Bryn Mawr for discussion of issues related to admission and financial aid well in advance of their expected date of entry

to the transfer institution. To facilitate this, Bryn Mawr will participate in student outreach (e.g.: transfer fairs, campus visits, and/or virtual open houses, etc.) at least once each fall/spring semester.

2. Collaborate in providing students with information and academic advising about this Agreement, Bryn Mawr 's academic requirements, and the process of transferring to Bryn Mawr.
3. Work together on program curriculum Transfer Guides that specify for CCP transfer students the CCP courses that satisfy requirements needed for both associate and bachelor's degree completion. Transfer guides are included in this Agreement.
4. Ensure that the current Agreement prioritizes those students completing the Liberal Arts Honors major, and students in other majors completing at least one Honors cluster.
5. Continue to add academic programs to this Agreement. Both parties will develop program-to-program curriculum Transfer Guides for these additional academic programs so that that CCP transfer students can take the CCP courses that satisfy requirements for both associate and bachelor's degree completion. Additional academic programs may be added to this Agreement by mutual written agreement of both parties, which will be incorporated by reference as addenda to this Agreement.
6. Assure that appropriate personnel in their respective institutions are aware of this Agreement, will support it and will designate a representative to serve as an institutional liaison to distribute information and maintain the Agreement.
7. Encourage faculty from each institution teaching in the curriculum for which this Agreement has been developed to meet at least annually to discuss issues of curriculum and student development.
8. Neither Party will be permitted to use in any manner the name, trademark, designation, and/or logo of the other Party for any purpose without the other Party's prior written consent. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Bryn Mawr agrees that CCP is permitted to use Bryn Mawr's name on the CCP website to promote Bryn Mawr as an Articulation Partner in a manner consistent with the listings of CCP's other Articulation Partners, and to use Bryn Mawr's logo, as provided by Bryn Mawr to CCP, on the copy of this Agreement posted to the CCP website, during the term of this Agreement.
9. Collaborate to assess the effectiveness of this Agreement in meeting the needs of students.
10. Consult with each other through appropriate channels prior to implementing major changes in policy or curricula that directly affect students transferring under the terms of this Agreement, and keep each other informed of any other changes of policy or curricula that affect those students. Both Bryn Mawr and CCP will review this Agreement annually and make any changes upon mutual agreement, as needed. Such changes will become effective when both CCP and Bryn Mawr sign the revised document.
11. Bryn Mawr will encourage CCP transfer students to complete the appropriate associate degree before matriculation to Bryn Mawr in order to take advantage of this Agreement. If the CCP student chooses to transfer and matriculate to Bryn Mawr before completion of the associate degree, Bryn Mawr will encourage reverse transfer. Bryn Mawr will develop a reverse transfer credit process, which must be mutually agreed upon by both Bryn Mawr and CCP, that includes methodology to notify and assist students with this reverse transfer benefits.

12. Exchange aggregate data annually that will contribute to the maintenance and improvement of this Agreement, enhance the transfer process, and promote effective cooperation between institutions.
13. The parties will abide by their respective policies of nondiscrimination in regard to sex, age, race, color, creed, national origin, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity, veteran status or any other status protected by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972, the American with Disabilities Act, or any other applicable federal, state, or local law. The parties agree to reasonably cooperate with each other in any investigation of claims of discrimination or harassment, to the extent permitted by law.

In conformity with the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, it is the policy of Bryn Mawr College not to discriminate on the basis of sex in its employment practices, educational programs or activities. The admission of only women in the Undergraduate College is in conformity with a provision of the Civil Rights Act.

### **Revision, Renewal and Termination of this Agreement**

Bryn Mawr College's Provost and Community College of Philadelphia's Provost and Vice President for Academic & Student Success or their designees, are responsible for identifying, and communicating to each other, changes in the policies or requirements of their respective institutions that affect this Agreement. Modifications to the terms and conditions of this Agreement may only be made by written agreement of the parties. Until such modification by mutual written agreement, the then-current terms of the Agreement shall remain in effect.

This Agreement will be in effect as of the date of its signing, for students entering Bryn Mawr on or after Fall 2024, and will continue in effect for five (5) years unless otherwise modified or terminated in accordance with this Agreement. Either institution may terminate this Agreement at any time by written notice at least one year in advance of the effective date of termination. Should this Agreement be terminated, it is understood that students already accepted to Bryn Mawr through the effective date of termination will continue to receive the benefits articulated in this Agreement.

Provided that all parties execute a copy of this Agreement, this Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original, and all of which together shall constitute one and the same document. This Agreement may be executed by the parties and transmitted by facsimile or electronic transmission, and, if so executed and transmitted, shall be effective as if the parties had delivered an executed original of this Agreement.

The willingness of both institutions to enter this Agreement in order to facilitate the transfer of students from CCP into Bryn Mawr, and to expand their opportunities for academic success there, is indicated by the following signatures.

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**General Information:** This transfer guide was developed in support of the Core-to-Core and Program-to-Program transfer articulation Agreement and between Community College of Philadelphia and Bryn Mawr College. It shows how the Associate in Arts (A.S.) in Biology at Community College of Philadelphia transfers to the “Artium Baccalaureus” (A.B.) (Latin for Bachelor of Arts) in Biology at Bryn Mawr College and then shows the remaining requirements at Bryn Mawr College.

Completion of the A.S. in Biology as described in this guide leads to junior standing in the A.B. at Bryn Mawr College.

At Bryn Mawr College, students must earn a total of 32 “units” to complete the A.B. degree. Each Bryn Mawr College course is equivalent to one unit; thus 32 units is equivalent to 128 Community College of Philadelphia semester hours/credits. To receive transfer credit, courses must be completed with a grade of C or better although the associate degree must be completed with a minimum 3.6 cumulative GPA to be considered for admission into Bryn Mawr College.

Students who earn an A.A. in Biology will receive 16 units (the equivalent of 4 semesters) and will enter Bryn Mawr College as juniors with four full-time fall and spring semesters remaining. A standard full-time Bryn Mawr College semester course load is four 1-unit courses. Students must complete the remaining 16 units in residence; given this, upon transfer, students pursuing the A.B. in Biology at Bryn Mawr College will take 7 or 8 units in the Biology major.

Additionally, Bryn Mawr College requires of all transfer students to take two Physical Education electives and satisfy Bryn Mawr College’s swim requirement.

The guides show how the requirements for the appropriate Community College of Philadelphia associate degree transfer to the bachelor's institution. It is, however, possible for program requirements at Community College of Philadelphia or the transfer institution to change without advanced notice.*

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**CURRICULUM TRANSFER AGREEMENT GUIDELINE**

<b>Community College of Philadelphia Program:</b> Associate in Science in Mathematics <b>Catalog:</b> 2024-2025	<b>Transfer School:</b> Bryn Mawr College <b>Bachelor Program:</b> “Artium Baccalaureus” (A.B.) in Mathematics.
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**General Information:** This transfer guide was developed in support of the Program-to-Program transfer articulation Agreement and between Community College of Philadelphia and Bryn Mawr College. It shows how the Associate in Arts (A.S.) in Mathematics at Community College of Philadelphia transfers to the “Artium Baccalaureus” (A.B.) (Latin for Bachelor of Arts) in Mathematics at Bryn Mawr College and then shows the remaining requirements at Bryn Mawr College.

Completion of the A.S. in Mathematics as described in this guide leads to junior standing in the A.B. at Bryn Mawr College (but does not satisfy Bryn Mawr College’s core-to-core).

At Bryn Mawr College, students must earn a total of 32 “units” to complete the A.B. degree. Each Bryn Mawr College course is equivalent to one unit; thus 32 units is equivalent to 128 Community College of Philadelphia semester hours/credits. To receive transfer credit, courses must be completed with a grade of C or better although the associate degree must be completed with a minimum 3.6 cumulative GPA to be considered for admissions into Bryn Mawr College.

Students who earn an A.A. in Mathematics will receive 16 units (the equivalent of 4 semesters) and will enter Bryn Mawr College as juniors with four full-time fall and spring semesters remaining. A standard full-time Bryn Mawr College semester course load is four 1-unit courses. Students must complete the remaining 16 units in residence; given this, upon transfer, students pursuing the A.B. in Mathematics at Bryn Mawr College will take 5 units in the Mathematics major.

Additionally, Bryn Mawr College requires of all transfer students to take two Physical Education electives and satisfy Bryn Mawr College’s swim requirement.

*Transfer guides are created and maintained to help students and staff make appropriate course and program choices. The guides show how the requirements for the appropriate Community College of Philadelphia associate degree transfer to the bachelor's institution. It is, however, possible for program requirements at Community College of Philadelphia or the transfer institution to change without advanced notice.*
