## **Proposed Revision to the Interior Design Program**

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# Proposal for Curriculum Revision Background and Rationale

ADC faculty are unanimous in creating a plan to address the concerns of the Student Outcomes Committee of the Board of Trustees regarding the Academic Audit for the Interior Design Program. The committee members were interested in ways the Program could improve the graduation rates, and the ADC faculty recommend the following two changes to the Interior Design curriculum:

- 1. To bring both the Interior Design Program into correspondence with College-wide general education requirements, and also to make program completion simpler for students, ADC faculty recommend reducing the number of credits by three, by removing the second Social Science Elective (no longer required).
- 2. ADC faculty propose to add a course to the list of "Directed Electives" in the Interior Design Program. ADC 163 Digital Documentation will be added to that list, allowing students more choices to complete the Interior Design Program requirements. The faculty concurs that this course is very valuable for students and will help prepare them for part- or full-time employment during the early stages of their careers. ADC 163 should therefore be added to the list of directed electives.

This change will reduce the minimum number of credits in from 67 to 64, a change that is consistent with the goal of the College to reduce the number of credits needed for graduation, and these changes will likely have a positive impact on completion rates.
